Final Comments & Questions

From the technical perspective, the thesis is logically organised and level of language appropriate for a work of this type. It also represents a competent, albeit somewhat one-sided view of Thatcher's foreign policy: events are viewed primarily from a Thatcherite perspective with relatively little space given to the numerous voices in the 1980s who objected to what they saw as her dogmatism, even warmongering. To what extent Mrs Thatcher herself was instrumental in the fall of communism (as opposed to merely offering moral support to US President Ronald Reagan) is a matter for academic debate. One's own feeling is that the Conservative Party, along with right-wing authors and commentators in Britain, have tended to exaggerate her influence; on the basis of this final work, Mr Ševčík would probably disagree but this is something which can be discussed at the defence.

The primary drawback of the thesis is that essentially it does not seem to offer anything new or insightful which might cause an already partially committed reader to pause for thought and possible reconsider his/her view of Mrs Thatcher. In other words, there is no great attempt at originality here, a factor which cannot be entirely ignored when determining the final mark.
