I would like the author to address the following questions during her defense:

- What do you mean by the term "recove dovednosti" that you use frequently in your thesis (e.g. p. 20)?
- Why did you divide the analysis of the data by gender (boys and girls)? What does it mean to know a word in a foreign language? Do you truly believe that IWBs are a useful tool for students to learn new vocabulary?
