Final Comments & Questions

The above assessed undergraduate thesis deals with a linguistic discipline – semantics, mainly on sense relations, changes of meaning and figures of speech. The author focuses on the contemporary English songs and analyses their lyrics from the point of view of using various figures of speech. The aim of the work is clearly stated: by means of analysis of the lyrics of individual songs, the authors attempts at finding and identifying individual figures of speech and determining the most common ones.

The theoretical part of the work provides relevant information from the area of semantics and presents a list of individual figures of speech with particular examples of each (some of them could have been explained in more detail and illustrated by more suggested examples).

In the practical part the author then examines individual songs and searches for any examples of figures of speech. The results of the analysis are summarized into a circular graph showing individual cases and their frequency.

The conclusions drawn from the analysis are stated in a detailed way and provide a clear idea of the number and type of literary figures which can be found in the lyrics of contemporary songs. The language and the lay-out of the work is very good and the work as a whole definitely meets all the requirements put on a piece of academic writing.
