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Final Comments & Questions

This is a mature and well balanced sample of a graduate thesis, worthy of notice for both, its focus and actual execution. Starting with a complex overview of relevant theoretical findings drawn from a representative selection of publications (both, English and Czech sources), it is complemented by an equally thorough class research based on a well planned and justified methodology. I also appreciate the author's critical reflections on the results of the "experiment", which - perhaps surprisingly - did not confirm the expected advantages of using comics in ELT. Despite the limitations of the research mainly due to the low number of participants belonging to one age group only, the results make one ponder both, historical and cultural specifics and changing nature of learners within the global context as well as the ever increasing dominance of technology and media over the printed matter (as the mentioned meme popularity illustrates -p. 33). Last but not least, though not specifically assessed above, the material contained in the appendices should be seen as an integral and equally valuable component of the thesis.
